





Thematic Clusters related to NSSS Action Plan




 Thematic cluster is a grouping social security programmes under a theme or subject matter of the programmes







- Threat of artificial fibre/fabrics and in the textiles sector.
- how to produce cost effective jute bag to drive out plastic and polythene bag.
